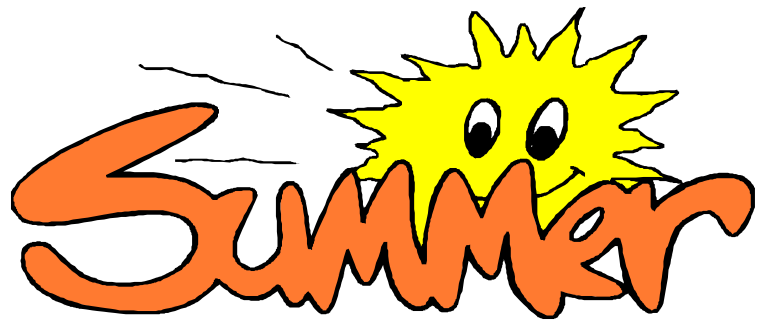

You remember September 11, 2001 as well as I do – the numbing shock of what we saw on television or heard, without understanding, on the radio. That morning is certainly etched in my mind, still fresh ten years after. As the reality of those horrible events sunk in I began considering how to gather people for prayer and support. After a couple of hours of uncertainty and confusion it was decided that my congregation, Immanuel Lutheran in Escanaba, Michigan would host a prayer service that evening. Since Escanaba is a small city of about 13,000 there was just one service that day. We hastily made signs, found police officers to direct traffic, and gathered local clergy to plan what we would do and say. The church was packed and we sang and prayed with a sense of loss beyond words or comprehension. The death of the mastermind behind the attacks of ten years ago has rekindled some of the emotion of those days. Many of the families who had lost loved ones in those attacks have shared the emotional upheaval that Bin Laden's death has caused. We are all in a different place than we were in 2001.

After 9/11 many people who had a Middle Eastern appearance began to suffer hate and discrimination. Since my cousin married a man from Beirut, Lebanon the restaurant that they owned lost business overnight. Many people that they knew were shunned. Muslims became feared and still suffer from the public's feeling that they cannot be trusted. We must counter hate and discrimination with love, acceptance, and inclusion. The church is the place where those positive characteristics should be most evident.

I invite you to examine how you see

the people around you. Do you make judgments about who can be trusted and who cannot by some outward criteria? Is there some mental checklist that you go through to determine who is "acceptable" and who is not. We all make those judgments but perhaps now we can be more aware of how we may be placing people into social boxes and alienate and diminish the humanity of those who do not look or act like us. Many who encountered Jesus after the resurrection did not at first recognize him. Look at your neighbor and see if you can recognize the face of Christ.

Financial News

Our church budget is planned with anticipated giving in operating fund and mortgage fund to average \$22,575 each month. Our contributions in these funds through April are:

January:	\$25,611
February:	\$19,895
March:	\$19,642
April:	\$19,394

Needless to say, our giving is not where it needs to be in order to meet our financial obligations. This is hampered our committees to move in the direction they would like to go. We have definite monthly expenses, such as salaries, mortgage, insurance and utilities. Our gas/electric bill alone is over \$1,000 per month.

Past history has shown that there is a decrease in giving in the summer months. We are asking that you keep up your giving as best you can in the coming months. Remember that church expenses do not go on vacation.

Finally, please consider electronic giving, either weekly, semi-monthly or monthly. Forms and instructions are available in the kiosk at church.

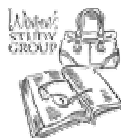

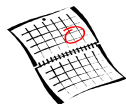

Dear Mt. Meru Users;

In the past year the prices of coffee and the price paid to the producers, including the farmers who grow coffee for the Mt. Meru Coffee Project, have risen to equal the price levels that were paid prior to the 1990's, when coffee farmers were making a decent living. In the 1990's coffee prices fell sharply, so much so that many farmers struggled to survive or gave up trying to make their living growing coffee.

For the past 10 years the Mt. Meru Coffee Project, using an economically supportive and just payment program has helped many farmers to survive and even thrive during this period of low market pricing.

Ten years ago we started by paying farmers \$2.00 per pound when prices were as low as .50 cents a pound. A couple years ago we increased to \$2.20 a pound as prices approached \$1.25 to \$1.75 per pound. Today prices, on average, are exceeding \$2.00 to \$2.50 per pound, and in some instances approaching \$3.00 per pound.

The price of coffee is historically cyclical and, as with most commodities, subject to supply and demand pressures. Presently coffee prices are increasing. This is due in part to climatic change, either too much rain, not enough rain, or rains at the wrong time, --having a devastating effect on coffee production in most every producing country. At the same time increased demand in emerging markets, such as China, has put pressure on a shrinking supply.

The big guys in the coffee business have had to increase retail prices to 10 to 15 percent to compensate for these increases. At this time the Mt. Meru Coffee Project is reluctantly required to do the same so that we can be fully prepared to provide our coffee farmers with a supportive and just payment as they start picking coffee in the next few months. Most importantly we must increase prices so that the Coffee Project survives and thrives in these times of higher prices, assuring that it can be there on the down cycle when the coffee farmers are again in need of our support.

Therefore, effective June, 1, 2011 12 ounce packages of Coffee will be priced at \$10.00 and 4 pound packages will be priced at \$45.00.

Please note that I will sell the current stock at the current prices and if you wish to order before the price increase please see me after services.

## Flood Buckets

We have another outreach opportunity that we hope can be accomplished. I suggest we try to collect materials for at least 10 of these Flood Bucket kits. The anticipated value is about \$56.00 but some frugal dollar store shopping and specials hunting at some of the Big Box home centers can get buckets put together more cheaply. The contents are listed below. Any buckets over the initial 10 we will keep here for local distribution if floods occur again as they did some years ago along the Little Menomonee River since the contents keep for a long time. Below is the information from Lutheran Disaster Relief.

With the right materials, many families can begin the overwhelming job of cleaning up after a flood on their own. Our partner – Church World Service – collects and distributes these kits to those in need. Put together Flood Buckets using the following instructions:

Flood Bucket value: \$56

Bucket Contents:

One five-gallon bucket with re-sealable lid

Bleach (two 1-quart or one 82 oz. bottle) Please note: Only include bleach if you will be using or distributing the buckets locally. Do **NOT** include bleach if you are shipping through the US Postal Service, UPS or FedEx.

Five scouring pads

Seven sponges, assorted sizes

One scrub brush

Eighteen cleaning towels (reusable, like Easy Wipes®)

One 50-78 oz. box dry laundry detergent

One 12 oz. bottle of liquid concentrated household cleaner (like Lysol®)

One 25 oz. bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®)

One package of 48-50 clothespins

Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.

Five dust masks

Two pairs latex gloves (like Playtex®)

One pair work gloves

28-bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon)

One 6-9 oz. bottle of insect repellent (pump, drops or lotion, not aerosol)

Please provide all liquids in new, unopened plastic bottles. Be sure to send only new materials. Place all items in the plastic bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment, and seal lid with packing tape. Note: If the requested item size is not available, go down to the next available size. If nothing is available in the requested or smaller size, put masking tape on the outside of the bucket saying, "This bucket contains no \_\_\_\_\_"
